Summary of the project	The research aims to appraise the perceptions, engagement and level of knowledge of young citizens (15-19 years of age) towards 'smart city' developments in key urban areas in the European context and evaluate how such perceptions hinder or enable cases of co-production of urban spaces. The project aims to compare cases of innovative youth engagement within planning practices and strategies of co-production of space in the examined cities and situate those in the context of smart/digital agendas and planning theories of participation.
